Recent Grants:

The Foundation has made grants recently for:

- 👉 The third Reg Rowe Art Scholarship of \$5,000 was granted in April 2010 to local young artist Sarah Eddowes.
- 👉 The Cancer Centre received \$7,500 for equipment including 3 special air mattresses.
- 👉 The Foundation has given grants recently for The Ted Kennedy Aboriginal Fund Youth groups including The Bowral Youth Refuge were granted funds.
- 👉 The BDCU Childrens Foundation received a grant to assist the employment of a pediatric nurse who visits sick children at home.

Youth Philanthropy

The Foundation employs a part time Youth Philanthropy Officer who manages a group of young people MAD (Make A Difference) Youth. They recently did a unique project called Gr8 2 Give which was designed to showcase philanthropy in high school students. The students worked with local charities to develop an innovative fund raising concept, and the winning school Bowral High won \$1,000 and their chosen charity Bowral Youth Refuge also won \$1,000. This project will also take place in 2011, and was funded by The Myer Foundation and the Kazacos Foundation. MAD Youth also hold several events throughout the year with a Tenpin Bowling Competition in October 2010.
